BUILD YOUR OWN COLLAGE

Supplies

- Glue or glue stick
- Scissors
- Magazines, newspapers, photographs (include some newspaper to cover your workspace for easier clean-up)
- Paper for backing (cardstock or construction paper works best, but computer paper is fine)
- Cut-out letters (optional)
- Markers, colored pencils, or paint (optional)



Instructions

- Come up with a theme. This will help you plan what goes on your collage. Some ideas: by color, creating a landscape (forest, desert, city, etc.), or around a concept (evoking an emotion, making a frame around a quote or a poem, or as a background for a poster). Alternatively, you can just cut out pictures that appeal to you and build a collage with these pieces.
- 2. Cut your pieces closely along the border so they are easier to layer. Using rounded cuts can make the pieces fit together more organically than sharp shapes, unless that's what you prefer!
- 3. Play around with the layout before you start applying glue and fixing your pieces on permanently. Contemplate what will go in the background or foreground. Layering can create a depth of field. You can incorporate 3D objects like pressed flowers, yarn, or tissue paper for a more textured effect.
- 4. Glue the separate pieces down once you like the layout you have. Try to cover all of the backing paper with your collage. Don't worry about going over the edges of the backing paper. It's unique that way.
- 5. Marvel at your completed collage! Or add to it with text or paint, whatever inspires you.
