Hunt List	Description	Example Picture
Make a portrait of someone in your home.	Try this with family members, pets, stuffed animals - and even yourself!	
Photograph a reflection.	Mirrors may be the first thing we think of for this task, but what else can you find that's reflective?	
Photograph your initials.	If you can't find your initials written out already, make them!	

Make a photograph using natural light from a window.	Check all of your windows to find the light you like best! What will you photograph in that light?	
Photograph a circle.	What round shapes can you find in your home?	
Photograph a texture.	What textures look interesting when you get up close? Soil from a potted plant? Grains of rice? A shaggy rug?	
Make a photograph of your favorite at-home activity.	If you like to draw, maybe you'll photograph one of your drawings. Or if you like to bake, maybe it'll be a picture of a pie. Think about how else you might show these things. A close-up of your pens or a floury apron? Think outside the box!	

Photograph something red.	This could be as simple as a red sweater in the closet or constructing a scene with as many red things as you can find. What else does red make you think of? Try photographing that as well!	
Photograph movement.	Maybe the movement is obvious, like children or pets playing. Maybe it's implied, like the face of a watch.	
Make a photograph that evokes a memory.	What can you find that brings back memories? An old teddy bear? A flower in the backyard? A worn paperback?
